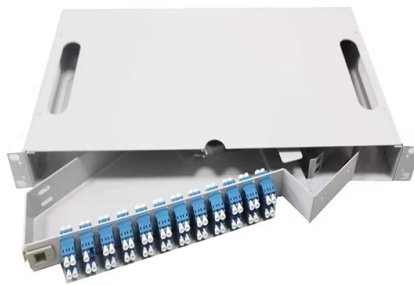

Durability: Kevlar-reinforced jackets and high-grade casing materials improve longevity and handling.

Applications: Commonly used for intra-rack connections, inter-rack connections, cross-connect frames, FTTH/building entry, and test/measurement setups.
