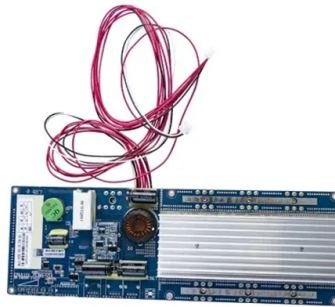


How to connect multiple optical fiber cables

Align and Fuse: Place the fibers in a fusion splicer, which precisely aligns and fuses the fibers using an electric arc, creating a permanent joint.
Protect the Splice: Cover the fused area with a protective sleeve to prevent mechanical damage.
Test the Splice: Verify the connection with an optical power meter to ensure low insertion loss and high signal quality.
